

of this State that the said Simon Sherry has fled from Justice, and  
is believed to have taken refuge in the said State of Pennsylvania.  
And it being important and highly necessary for the good of Society that the  
perpetrators of such offences shou'd be brought to Justice. Now, therefore, I  
Thomas W. Kezey, Governor, by Virtue of the authority vested in me by the  
Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby demand the said  
Simon Sherry as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and make known  
to your Excellency that I have appointed David W. Hudson Esq; Warden  
of the Jail of Baltimore City and County, my agent to receive the said  
fugitive and bring him to this State, having Jurisdiction of the said offence,  
that he may be brought to trial therefor.

In compliance with the requisitions of the Law, I herewith  
append and produce to your Excellency a copy of the depositions upon which  
this Demand is founded; which I certify is authentic.

The following Commission and instruction was issued to the  
aforesaid agent. Viz.

The State of Maryland, To David W. Hudson Esq; Warden  
of the Jail of Baltimore City and County, greeting. Be it  
known, that reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence  
and honesty, I Thomas W. Kezey, Governor of the State of Maryland,  
have appointed you my agent to receive from His Excellency the  
Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, Simon Sherry a fugitive from  
the Justice of this State, and I do hereby authorise and direct you, upon  
receiving the said fugitive to bring him into this State and keep him  
in your custody in the Jail of the City and County aforesaid to  
answer for having on the tenth day of August last, and at divers other days  
and times between that and the tenth day of the next month, at the City  
aforesaid, with force and arms, committed a Riot or Sunday Blood, and  
with breaking and entering kind of destroying the houses of various Citizens  
of said City, and with burning and destroying divers goods and chattels  
and furniture of said Citizens, to the evil example of all others in like cases  
offending, to the common wrong of all good and peaceable inhabitants, and  
against the peace government and dignity of the State of Maryland.
