

in said message, were made by order on the Treasury date the 19th day of August 1833. On the 17th day of August 1835, an order on the Treasury was passed in favour of Judge Buchanan and Reviser Johnson Esquire, for three thousand dollars in full compensation for their services, including those of James Raymond Esquire then assistant, as revisors, and an order on the Treasury for two hundred and ninety seven dollars, was, on the same day, passed in favour of Jeremiah Hughes Esquire, for printing so much of the work as had been printed.

The foregoing and all the payments which appear to have been made by the Executive to the revisors or others engaged in any manner upon the work.

I transmit you a communication from Reviser Johnson Esquire, in relation to the services of J. M. Raymond, the assistant of Judge Buchanan and himself, which has not before been communicated to the Legislature and I also transmit you a copy of the Report of Messrs Buchanan and Johnson, referred to in the message of January 1834. No other report of the revisors, or either of them, on this subject, is on file in this Department.
