Gentlemen of the Senate, and  
of the House of Delegates:

We lay before you a communication from Thomas Shriver Esquire, Superintendent of that part of the National or Cumberland Road lying within the limits of this State, which contains information and suggestions worthy of your consideration.

We also lay before you communications, severally from the Honorable Robert C. Goltsborough, one of the Senators of this State in the Congress of the United States, and from the Honorable, Shubert Steele, Benjamin C. Howard and Isaac McKim, members of the House of Representatives of the United States, from this State, acknowledging the receipt of the Resolutions which you recently passed on the subject of placing buoys on sites in the Rivers, Straights and Sounds in the lower part of the Eastern Shore.
