By the petition of Benjamin Gardner, and a transcript from the Records of Charles County Court, it appears that he had entered into a recognizance in the sum of one hundred dollars for his appearance before the said County Court at August Term 1833 to testify for the State against Richard Gray.

The petitioner states, on oath, that his failure to attend the said Court was without any intention of disrespect on his part towards the Court; that in the regular prosecution of his medical studies it became necessary for him to attend the Medical Lectures in Baltimore, and that during his absence his name was called at his recognizance forfeited, altho his brother was in attendance and appeared before the grand Jury, when he, no doubt, gave precisely such testimony as would have been given by him, if there, his said brother having a full knowledge of the facts in the case, and it being a matter of indifference which should be recognized as a witness, as will appear. He therefore prays for a remission of the said forfeiture. And it appearing from a certificate of John Hughes Esquire, the Justice of the Peace who took said recognizance that the material facts of said statement are true, we do hereby remit the said forfeiture.
