Licenses for the Treasurer of the Eastern Shore and \$3 for publishing a
Proclamation of Congressional Election, by order of the Executive for amount
allowed.

Wednesday February 24th 1836.

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Captain
George S. Stockett or order one hundred and sixteen dollars for the
services of himself and the troops under his command called out to quell
the Riots of the Baltimore and Washington Rail Road, for amount
allowed, under Resolution of the last General Assembly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Ellen
Schmuck, widow of Captain Jacob Schmuck, late of the United States
Army, or to her order for the use and Education of Catherine Schmuck,
the daughter and only child of the said Captain Schmuck, in virtue
of a Resolution of the General Assembly passed at the present Session.

by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following Civil
