Monday February 29 1836

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

The following message was adopted, and sent by the Clerk of the  
Council to the General Assembly: viz

Executive Department,

Annapolis February 29 1836

Gentlemen of the Senate, and  
of the House of Delegates,

In compliance with the request of His Excellency  
Littleton W. Tazewell, Governor of the State of Virginia, I herewith submit  
for your consideration, sundry Resolutions of the General Assembly of that  
State in relation to domestic Slavery, the rights of the States, where it exists,  
the formation and proceedings of Abolition Societies, and the duties of  
non-slaveholding States, to suppress or restrain such Societies.

With the highest respect, I have  
the honor to remain, your Obedient  
Thos. W. Tazewell

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to  
Joshua Sergey, a free coloured man, on account of assaulting and  
beating Caroline Hall, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City  
Court at November Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to pay a  
fine of one dollar, and to suffer six months imprisonment.
