By a recommendation from the Judges of Batt^y of City Court
and a transcript from the Records of the said Court, it appears that

for five months on his forfeited Recognizance. The Court have satisfactory reasons
for believing that he is wholly unable to pay any part of the penalty or costs,
as he has been pretty severely punished for his imposition on the Magistrate,
in representing himself to be good Security, when he was not. The Court write
in recommending to His Excellency the Governor a remission of the said
penalty, and that he be discharged from further imprisonment. Upon
consideration whereof we do hereby remit the said forfeiture.
