

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to William Buckmaster, on account of stealing, for which he was committed in Calvert County Court at a May Term 1836, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Pardon Record).

Monday May 23^d 1836.

The Council having been called to meet this day His Excellency Thomas M. Neasey attended.

The following Order was issued for the Surrender of the person therein named, as a fugitive from Justice, upon the information and evidence therein mentioned being produced to His Excellency the Governor viz

To the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore City and County, greeting. Whereas, it appears from authentic Documents Certified and transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, by His Excellency Joseph Ritner Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, that a certain person calling himself James Jones, stands charged on oath with having in his possession a quantity of Watches, Jewelry &c. believed to be the property of Jacob Nonner, whose store in Calowhill Street in the County of Philadelphia was, on or about the ninth of April last, robbed of the same, and that the said James Jones has fled from the Justice of the said State, and taken refuge within the State of Maryland, and is now confined in Prison in the City of Baltimore. And whereas the said Joseph Ritner Governor as aforesaid, hath in pursuance of the Authority given in such cases by the Constitution and Laws of the United States demanded the said James Jones of the Executive of this State, as a fugitive from Justice, and appointed John Duncan Esquire, his agent to receive the said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania for trial for the said offense. Now therefore, Thomas M. Neasey Governor of the State of Maryland, have thought proper in compliance with the said demand, to order and direct the Surrender of the said fugitive; and I do hereby order and direct that you forthwith deliver the said James Jones, if he is in your custody, to the said James Duncan Esquire, agent as aforesaid, he the said agent first paying all costs of the arrest and detention of the said fugitive.
