His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Benjamin
Lofman, on account of shooting James Fisher with intent to kill, for which
he was convicted in Kent County Court, and for which he was sentenced to
three months imprisonment. (See Parson Record)

By the petition of James Harrison of Calvert County, and some
transcripts from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears that
Judgment was obtained by the State of Maryland against the said James
Harrison, as Security for Henry S. Harrison for the year 1832 for \$223.17
the amount of fines, forfeitures and Taxes in Chancery, paid in the hands
of the said Sheriff that year for collection. The petitioner states, and it
appears from a copy made by the Clerk of said County that the amount
upon which the Judgment was rendered was erroneous, inasmuch as the
Clerk made a mistake in adding up the fines of \$45. having counted 5
for 50. He states further that there several individuals against
whom the forfeitures are, were at the time insolvent and not able to
pay any part, except Benjamin Owens from whom he collected \$5,
he therefore prays to be released from said fines and forfeitures. And
the Commissioners of Calvert County having stated that having been called on
to state their knowledge concerning the solvency of the persons named in the
List of fines and forfeitures, do certify that all persons except Mr Benjamin
Owens are insolvent, and are not, nor was not, able to pay those sums
opposite their names, at the time of their forfeiture, and the Honorable
Thomas H. Wilkinson one of the associate Judges of the said County having
recommended a remission of the aforesaid forfeitures, do do hereby remit
the same. His forfeiture by Isaac Davis and Samuel Ward each \$50,
and by Isaac Wardell and Holcomb's Sprunger each \$30.
