

By a transcript from the Records of Washington County Court, it appears that Anthony Snyder Jr, Andrew Hartman and Jacob Hartman entered into recognizance in the sum of one hundred dollars for the appearance of the said Anthony Snyder Jr before the said County Court at April Term 1834, and that the said Recognizance has been forfeited.

It also appears by the deposition of Doct James J Beatty, that the said Beatty was attending Physician of Anthony Snyder Jr during a spell of sickness in April 1834 that the said Snyder was incapable of attending at any time of November Term 1834 (to which the said recognizance was respite) of Washington County Court. And one of the Judges of the said Court having recommended a remission of the said forfeiture, we do hereby remit the same.
