Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one dollar sixty two cents for contingent expenses of the Executive, amount allowed.

By Petitions and recommendations of Benjamin A. Lynch, James C. Jones, Samuel Farr, William Harrison, ~~John~~ McKewen, Peter Hannan, James Spencer, Joseph Napson, David Biggart and John Bowen, it appears that the said persons were severally indicted and convicted in Baltimore City Court at October Term 1835, of being concerned in the Riot of August last in the City of Baltimore, and severally sentenced therefor as follows, viz The said Benjamin A. Lynch to pay a fine of five hundred dollars, and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of four years, to commence from the 29th of December 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into Recognizance, with approved security, in the penalty of one thousand dollars, to keep the peace and be of good behavior for twelve months thereafter, the said James C. Jones to pay a fine of two hundred dollars and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence from the 9th day of April 1836, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance with approved security, in the sum of five hundred dollars to keep the peace and be of good behavior for twelve months thereafter, the said Samuel Farr to pay a fine of two hundred dollars, and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence on the 14th of December 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved
