

approved Security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said William Harrison to pay a fine of five hundred dollars, and be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of four years, to commence on the 26th day of December 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved Security, in the penalty of one thousand dollars to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said John McKeown to pay a fine of two hundred dollars, and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence from the 13th of August 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved Security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars, to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said Peter Harman to pay a fine of two hundred dollars and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence from the 29th of August 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved Security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars, to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said James Spence to pay a fine of two hundred dollars, and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence from the 8th of November 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved Security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said Joseph Dillapay to pay a fine of five hundred dollars, and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of four years, to commence from 24 August 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved Security, in the penalty of one thousand dollars, to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said David Baggart to pay a fine of two hundred dollars and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence from the 15th of August 1835, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance with approved Security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter; the said John Brown to pay a fine of two hundred dollars, and to be imprisoned in the common Jail for the term of two years, to commence from the 11th day of January 1836, and at the termination thereof to enter into recognizance, with approved Security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for twelve months thereafter. And the aforesaid persons having been recommended to Executive Clemency by a very large number of respectable citizens of the City of Baltimore, including most of the Jurors who found them guilty for reasons set forth at length in the said recommendations, upon consideration whereof the Governor and Council do hereby remit the said several fines, so far as the State is interested therein
