Ordered that the Clerk of the Council have transcribed the

referred to in Resolution 11th of the last General Assembly.

Contracted with Washington G. Tuck Armsman at Annapolis
for Fifty thousand Ball Cartridges to be made in the best manner
and of good suitable materials for \$1034.25.

Upon consideration of the act of the General Assembly passed
at the present extra Session, authorizing and requiring the Governor
and Council to contract for, or cause to be erected in any other manner
as they may deem best, a new Warehouse on a vacant Lot adjoining the
States Tobacco Inspection Warehouse near upon the Flammers of the division
as proposed in a plan and estimates made out by a building Mechanic
in the City of Baltimore, for the committee who visited that place in March
last, for the investigation of this subject, and also authorizing and requiring
them to contract for and purchase a Lot of ground adjoining the above
vacant Lot as proposed and recommended by the said visiting committee
the following Resolution was adopted Viz

Resolved that the proposal of John N. & Wm. Murphy
to superintend the building of said Warehouse for a compensation of
fourteen hundred dollars, be and the same is hereby accepted, upon
condition that the said John N. & Wm. Murphy shall enter into Bond
in the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars, with security to be approved
by Nathaniel S. Williams Esquire, to the Governor & Council for the faithful
superintendance of said building to furnish all the necessary plans and
drawings, to purchase all the necessary materials, of the best quality, and
upon the lowest obtainable terms, to employ and pay all the workmen
and labourers necessary for the erection and completion of said Warehouse
with the necessary fixtures, ready for use as a Tobacco Inspection Warehouse
at not more than the usual wages, and generally to superintend the
said building and therein to faithfully guard and protect the same
from all claims in relation thereto, and when completed, or from time
to time as may be required, to report to the Executive a full and particular
