

To John Haney alias Harry, on account of Stealing to the amount of thirty dollars, with which he was charged by Indictment in Baltimore City Jail.

Saturday July 9th 1836

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John A. Alexander or order five hundred dollars for one quarter salary as topographical Engineer due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Durbin or order seventy five dollars for one quarter salary as Armorer at Frederick due the first Instant.

Tuesday July 19th 1836

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard J. Crabb or order one hundred and thirty seven dollars fifty three cents for one quarter of ~~pay~~ due the first Instant viz for the Executive \$90.09, for the Treasurer \$13.33, for the Assistant General \$28.63, and for the Librarian \$5.48, of amount allowed.

A communication was received from the Honorable John C. Henry resigning his Seat as a member of the Council.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following Civil appointments were made and commissions issued accordingly viz

James Cheston a Commissioner, vice John Berry resigned, to examine and ascertain by view and by Subj. Pros. in and out as he and the other Commissioners may deem competent and sufficient the value of the property injured or destroyed in the City of Baltimore, in August last, by a tumultuous mob assembled in said City, as provided for by an act passed by the General Assembly at December Term in 1835, entitled an act to provide indemnity to the sufferers by certain Riots in the City of Baltimore, and to perform the other duties prescribed by the said act.
