Two of the Judges of the said Court having stated that believing that Ann Cuff a free coloured woman of good Character, and named in the within presentment had no intention to violate the Law in the case charged, we respectfully recommend your Excellency to remit the fine imposed upon her. We do therefore remit the said fine.

A Report having been received from Charles B. Fish Esquire, Engineer appointed by the Governor and Council, and George W. Hughes Esquire Engineer appointed by the Maryland Canal Company, of the Survey of the several routes for the said Maryland Canal as mentioned in said Report, upon full consideration thereof the following Preamble and Resolution was adopted and passed by the Governor and Council Viz

Whereas, by the eighth Section of an act of the General Assembly of this State passed at May Session 1826, entitled "An Act for the promotion of Internal Improvement," it is provided that "as to said subscription to the Stock of the Maryland Canal Company, before subscription shall be made, it shall, upon Report and estimate to be submitted to the Governor and Council, after an actual Survey of the said routes by Engineers to be appointed as hereinafter prescribed, be, by their Judgment ascertained, whether, and at what expense, the construction of said Company's Canal, with due supply of Water, be practicable from the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to the City of Baltimore, by the Valley of the Monocacy and Potomac, or by a route diverging from the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal at the mouth of Seneca River, exclusively within the limits of this State, and in order to said decision the Governor and Council may act upon any Report and estimate of any Engineer or Engineers of said Company, and of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and upon those of any
