And the Judges of the said Court have certified that it was clearly proved to their satisfaction that Mr Iye did not intend to deprive the Revenue of the State, and the said Judges having recommended a remission of said fine, we do hereby the same, so far as the State is interested therein.

The Petitioner states that he came to this State from Pennsylvania and purchased the Tavern stand of a certain John Baldwin then keeping Tavern with a regular License, and that he purchased and paid the said Baldwin for his License and sold under it believing from representations that the same was transferable, he therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And the Judges of the said Court having stated that they are satisfied by the evidence in the case that the defendant acted in ignorance of the Law and without a design to violate its provisions, and therefore recommended him to the Executive as entitled to a remission of his fine - we do therefore, hereby remit said fine.
