The State of Maryland, To the the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore County, Greeting
Whereas it appears from authentic documents certified and transmitted to the Executive
Department of this State, by His Excellency Joseph Ritner Governor of the State of Pennsylvania,
that a certain John Kline stands charged by the affidavits of James Neasey of the County of York
in the State of Pennsylvania, with having hired a horse & gig which he did not return to the owner,
but traded away the gig for furniture which he sold, and that the said John Kline has fled
from ^{the} Justice of the said State, and is now in Baltimore County Jail. And whereas the said Joseph
Ritner Governor as aforesaid, hath, in pursuance of the Authority given in such cases by the Constitution
and Laws of the United States, demanded the said John Kline of the Executive of this State as
a fugitive from Justice, and appointed Adam Eichelberger Esq. his agent to receive the
said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania for trial for the said offence.
Now therefore, Thomas M. Neasey Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby, in compliance
with the said demand, to be read and direct the surrender of the said fugitive,
and do hereby order and direct that you forthwith, deliver the said John Kline, if he
is in your custody, to the said Adam Eichelberger, agent as aforesaid, he the said agent first
paying all costs of the arrest and detention of the said fugitive - for all which this shall
be your sufficient warrant.

The State of Maryland, to wit. Whereas, in compliance with a demand of His
Excellency Joseph Ritner Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, orders have been given for
the surrender of a certain John Kline, as a fugitive from the Justice of the said State, to Adam
Eichelberger Esquire, agent duly appointed to receive the said fugitive and transport him
to the said State of Pennsylvania: it appearing from authentic documents certified and trans-
mitted to the Executive Department of this State, that the said John Kline stands charged
by affidavits of James Neasey of the County of York in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
with having hired a horse & gig which he did not return to the owner, but traded away
the gig for furniture which he sold. Now therefore, Thomas M. Neasey Governor of
the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State, to take
the said Adam Eichelberger agent as aforesaid, safe with the said fugitive unincumbered to
the said State of Pennsylvania; he the said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and
orderly manner and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said
