Saturday August 27th 1836

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Nathaniel F. Williams or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quartus salary as a member of the Council, due the first day of July last.

Thursday September 5th 1836

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay David Rigels or order one hundred and fifty four dollars eighty cents for transcribing Documents and papers under Resolution of the last General Assembly of amount.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John C. Henry or order one hundred and sixty one dollar twelve cents for one quartus salary six days salary as a member of the Council, up to the 26th of July last, when he resigned.

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to John P. Price on account of petit Larceny, of which he was convicted at August term 1836 in St. Marys County Court, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years, (granted) 17th Aug, but entry omitted in the proper place (See Pardon Record)

Friday September 2nd 1836

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John C. Cullbreth or order two hundred dollars for transcribing Documents and papers under Resolution of the General Assembly, of amount allowed.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted the following Pardon To John Walcott, on account of Violating the Condition of a former Pardon, requiring him to leave this State and never again return within its limits, of which he was convicted in Washington County Court at March Term 1836, and for which he was ~~committed~~ committed to the custody of the Sheriff of said County.

To George Harris, on account of Felony, of which he was convicted in St. Marys County Court, at August Term 1836, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Pardon Record)

Monday September 12th 1836

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John C. Little or order ten dollars for one years subscription to the Law Library of certificate of the Librarian, under Resolution of the General Assembly.
