Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George W. Hughes or order one thousand dollars, on account of the survey of the route of the Annapolis and Potomac Canal, under Resolution of the General Assembly - to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Philip Clayton or order two dollars fifty cents for taking down and putting up Chimney back in the Council Chamber, of amount allowed.
