


Whereas, by an act of the General Assembly of this State passed at November Session 1815, entitled "An act to reduce into one the several acts respecting Elections, and to regulate said Elections," it is declared "that the Governor & Council, on receiving the Returns of Elections for Electors to choose a President and Vice President of the United States shall enumerate and ascertain the number of Votes given for each and every person voted for as an Elector, and shall thereupon declare by Proclamation, signed by the Governor, the name of the person or persons duly Elected." And Whereas an Election was held on Monday the ~~eleventh~~ ^{fourteenth} Instant, agreeably to Law, in the several Counties of this State, for ten Electors to choose a President and Vice President of the United States, as aforesaid; and full Returns of the said Election having been received, and the number of Votes given for each and every person voted for as an Elector as aforesaid, having been enumerated and ascertained by the Governor & Council - We do by this our **P R O C L A M A T I O N**, declare, that, by the said returns it appears that, Elias Brown, James W. Beck, M. Williams Price, Anthony Kinnear, Thomas Buckland, David Hoffman, John S. Purnell, George Howard, James M. Coates and Robert M. Bowie were duly Elected Electors, on the part of this State, for choosing a President and Vice President of the United States.

 Given under my hand and the great Seal of the State of Maryland, this twenty second day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, and of the Independence of the United States the sixty fifth. **H. W. Neuzes**

Ordered that the foregoing Proclamation be published once a week for three weeks in the Maryland Republican, Annapolis; the Patriot & Chronicle, Baltimore; the Record, Frederick; the Torch Light & Gazetteer, Hagerstown; the Sentinel, Cumberland; the True American, Rockville; the Madisonian, Beltsville; the Banner, Upper Marlborough; the Elkton, the Bugle, Chestertown; the Times, Centerville; the Gazette, Easton; the Chronicle, Cambridge; the Prince-Ann, and the Snow Hill.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council proper and furnish the said Electors when assembled with the certificates of said Election required by Law -

on the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following Civil appointments were made, and commissions issued accordingly viz
