By the petition of Thomas Curtain, and a transcript from the
Records of Baltimore City, appears that the said Thomas Curtain had entered
into Recognizance in the sum of five hundred dollars for the appearance
of Robert Curtain before the said Court at October Term 1836 to answer
a charge of Forgery, and that the said Recognizance has been forfeited.

The Judges of the said Court having stated that on examination
of the above Recognizance and reference to the Record of proceedings in
the case, it appears that no Indictment was found by the Grand Jury
against said Curtain for the particular offense alleged in the Recognizance,
but for one of a different character, unknown to the Court at the time said
Recognizance was taken and not intended to be entered in it. The
Court are ~~of opinion~~ to think that Thomas Curtain is not exposed to
a forfeiture of his Recognizance unless it be under the general expressions
of all such matters and things as shall be alleged against him. If he
be the Court are of opinion that he is justly entitled to Executive
~~interference~~, and therefore recommend a remission of the penalty.
