Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Blair & Whis or to their order ten dollars for the Semi-Weekly Globe from the 20th of Jan'y 1835 to 20 Jan'y 1837, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order three dollars thirty seven cents paid by him for hauling wood from the Cellar to the front door, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard Thompson or order five dollars ninety four cents for Glap and glazing about the State House, & amount allowed.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following Civil appointments were made, and commissions issued accordingly, Viz

Thomas Robinson a Justice of the 3d District Court of a term in Cecil County, Nic Stewart resigned.

William Shiswell Surveyor of Montgomery County, Nic Waters resigned.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order twenty four dollars seven cents for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William R. Matthews or order fifty dollars for publishing in the Kent Bugle, Printing Laws
