

The following commission and instruction was issued to the

The State of Maryland, To Edward Talbot, Gentleman, Greeting.
Be it known, that, reposing especial trust and confidence in your prudence and
honesty, I Thomas M Nease, Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you
my agent to receive from His Excellency Joseph Ritner Governor of the State of
Pennsylvania, Magoes Iron, Phil. and Coffey, fugitives from the Justice of this
State; and I do hereby authorize and direct you, upon receiving the said
fugitives, to bring them into this State, and to convey and deliver them to the
Warden of the Jail of Baltimore City and County, to answer the charge of
having entered the House of Mr. Archibald Gettings, breaking upon a desk
and feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away money to the amount
of fifty dollars, in December 1829; and also of stealing and feloniously taking
away five Horses, the property of Mr. Archibald Gettings, in December 1829,
valued at two hundred dollars, with which they are charged by Indictments
in Baltimore City Court.
