

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John H. Longwell or order ten dollars for publishing in the Carrolltonian, the Proclamation of the Executive concerning the General Assembly, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George Keating or order ~~seventeen~~ ^{nine} dollars for publishing in the Madisonian the Proclamation of the Executive concerning the General Assembly, \$12, and for publishing in the same paper the Proclamation of the Election of Electors of President and Vice President of the United States, \$4, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry J. Thompson or order fifty six dollars nineteen cents for freight on Powder, Lead and Arms, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Stokatt P. Wilson or order eighteen dollars fifty cents for publishing in their paper the Proclamation of the Executive concerning the General Assembly, and also the Proclamation of the Election of Electors of President & Vice President of the United States, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order sixty nine dollars sixty nine cents for the purchase of firewood - to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jonas Green or order five dollars twenty five cents for publishing notice of the Librarian for proposals for Stationery, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Newnam or order one hundred and ninety five dollars fifty seven cents, viz for collecting Arms and advertising Sale of Same, \$39.32, and for cleaning Arms under Resolution of the General Assembly, \$156.25, & amount allowed.

Thursday (December 29th 1836)

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to Green J. Duke on account of a conspiracy with Richard M. Butts to fraudulently obtain possession of a Negro Slave from Henry Lyday and defrauding the said Henry Lyday of fifty dollars, of which he was convicted in Washington County Court at November Term 1835, and for which he was fined fifty dollars. Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson
