

Newman or order seventy five dollars for one quarters Salary as Announcer at Easton, due the first Instant.

The General Assembly, this day re-elected His Excellency Thomas M. Neasey Governor of Maryland.

Tuesday January 31st 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George G. Brewer or order seventy five dollars, for one quarters Salary as Clerk of the House of Delegates, due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas M. Neasey or order six hundred and sixty six dollars sixty six cents, for one quarters Salary as Governor, due the first Instant.

The General Assembly, this day re-elected Gideon Harris, Nathaniel F. Williams and William F. Johnson, of the Western Shore, and John M. Kerney and William L. Jones, Esquires of the Eastern Shore, Executive Council.

Thursday January 30th 1837.

His Excellency Thomas M. Neasey, Governor re-elect, appeared in the Senate Chamber this day, and in the presence of both branches of the General Assembly qualified as Governor, by taking the several oaths required by the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution and Laws of this State, and repeating and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, and thereupon attended in the Council Chamber.

It being represented by sundry members of the Bar of Anne Arundel County Court, that James Clark Esquire Sheriff Elect, and who had been commissioned, has not complied with the Law requiring him to give bond with approved Security as Sheriff, on or before the first day of January Instant, and that the public Interest and convenience require that there should be a Sheriff of said County - His Excellency the Governor issued a Commission to Caleb White, the other person returned with the said Clark for Sheriff of said County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Durbin or order seventy five dollars, for one quarters Salary as Announcer at Frederick, due the first Instant.

Friday January 30th 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard S. Cratt or order one hundred and thirty seven dollars thirty seven cents, for one quarters postage due the 1st Instant viz for the Executive \$93.00, for the Treasurer
