Speakers of the Senate, and

In compliance with the request of His Excellency J. B. Calhoun Governor of the State of Vermont, we herewith lay before you, Resolutions passed by the General Assembly of that State, in relation to the jurisdiction of persons and the transmission of them through the public mail, and the power of Congress to abolish Slavery and the Slave trade in the District of Columbia.
