I, in the absence of the Council, herewith transmit to you, several documents marked A, B, C, D, E & F, which with several others that were communicated by the Executive to the last General Assembly, and those communicated to you on the 28th Instant, will afford you all the information, within the embrace of your order, which the Executive, have at any time possessed.

This being the day prescribed by the Constitution and Form of Government for the Election of Governor, the General Assembly proceeded, by joint ballot of the Senate and House of Delegates to make said Election when his Excellency Thomas W.
