

Tuesday January 9th 1835

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Elijah Wells or order ten dollars for balance due him for repairs of his part of the Government House, & Certificate of R. W. Hill and W. G. Tuck Superintendent.

Wednesday January 10 1835

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel A. Nelson and Murphy or order three thousand dollars, on account of building a new Flour Warehouse, under contract with the Executive as authorized by Law, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas W. Neagy Governor or order three hundred and sixteen dollars eighty two cents for repairs and furniture for the Government House, of accounts allowed, under Resolutions of the General Assembly.

Thursday January 11 1835.
