

duties of that Office; that for the year 1837 a warrant was directed to him imposing similar duties, but to be performed on a different road; that not being aware that the last warrant embodied, requirements which the former gave his attention only to the duties imposed by the former, and thereby, un-intentionally, neglected a part of his duty, that he was prosecuted by the Grand Jury for said neglect and at August Term 1837, he brought his case to the Court, when a fine of \$5 was adjudged against him, that he is a very poor man, and at the said fine, and costs and is now imprisoned on that account. He therefore prays for a remission of said fine, and the said Court having recommended a compliance with his prayer, we do hereby remit said fine.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay He Posee or order seven dollars, for publishing a Proclamation in relation to Congressional Election, by order of the Executive, as authorized by Law.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Hughlett or order one hundred and forty dollars for attendance of meetings as a Representative of the State, of Stockholders of joint stock companies in which the State is interested, as provided for by Law, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Daniel Blocher or order five dollars for publishing in his paper Proclamations of Congressional Election, as provided for by Law, & amount allowed.
