

His Excellency Thomas M. Nease, Governor  
and William F. Hanson,  
The Honorable Thomas McKim, members of the  
Mrs McKim's Council.

The Honorable Mrs McKim qualifies as a member of the  
Council, by taking the Oaths required by the Constitution, and repeating  
and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion,  
before Edward Dubois Esquire, a Justice of the Peace in and for the  
Arundel County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Martin W  
Mettee or order eighteen dollars thirty six cents for repairs and fastenings of  
Gates around the State House (circle) for amount allowed.

Tuesday January 23rd 1838

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday and  
the Honorable Benedict J. Heard, who appeared and qualifies as a  
member of the Council, by taking the Oaths required by the Constitution  
and repeating and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian  
Religion.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Joseph  
Sands or order five dollars thirty four cents, for freight on articles for the  
Library, for amount allowed.

Wednesday January 24th 1838.

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and  
with the advice and consent of the Council, the following civil  
appointment was made, and commission issued accordingly, viz

William F. Greenwood, an additional Justice of the Peace  
in and for Kent County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Adam  
Schwartz or order one dollar and fifty cents, for freight on articles  
for amount allowed.

Thursday January 25th 1838.

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

On the nomination of the Governor, and by and with the  
advice and consent of the Council, the following Military appo-  
intments were made, and commissions issued accordingly, viz
