

The following Bonds were examined and approved viz
William R. Stewart and Edward Hughes as Lottery
Commissioners and Joseph Adams as Keeper of the Penitentiary.

Friday February 25th 1838.

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to Henry Fisher
on account of Felony of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court
at February Term Instant.

Saturday February 26th 1838.

Thomas Vickers's Bond as Wharfinger was approved.

Wednesday February 28th 1838.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay Henry
Thompson or order fourteen dollars fifty seven cents for the purchase of
fuel to be accounted for.

Friday March 2nd 1838.

His Excellency the Governor granted the following Pardons
and Nolle Prosequis viz

To Richard Pearce a Pardon, on account of Felony of
which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at February Term last.

To Samuel R. Bartleson, a Pardon, on account of stealing a
Boat of the Value of \$7, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court,
at February Term last.

To Lisetta Marmestem, a Nolle Prosequi, on account of
two charges, pending against her by presentment in Baltimore City
Court, one for conspiring to depard John Santing, and other for Felony.

To Lewis Tinges, a Nolle Prosequi on account of charge
of Stealing Tobacco, which was pending against him by Indictment
in Anne Arundel County Court.

Upon the petition of Samuel Gardenow and Ann Grove
praying to be released from the forfeiture of a Recognizance in the
sum of eighty dollars which they had entered into for the appearance of
the said Samuel Gardenow before Washington County Court, and
to indemnify Washington County against the support of an illegitimate
child of Esther Allen, upon the charge of said Esther Allen that the
said Samuel was the father of said child, his Excellency the Governor
remitted the said forfeiture.
