

Tuesday March 6th 1838.

Up on the petition of Martin Burnam, Mordecai Burgess & Joseph Arnold, praying to be released from the forfeiture of a recognizance which they had entered into, the said Martin Burnam in the sum of one hundred dollars, and the said Mordecai Burgess and Joseph Arnold, in the sum of fifty dollars each, for the appearance of the said Martin Burnam before Prince Georges County Court, at April Term 1837 and to keep the peace, His Excellency the Governor remitted the said forfeiture.

Wednesday March 7 1838.

His Excellency the Governor remitted a fine of ten dollars imposed by the Seventh Election District Court of Prince Georges County, upon John McMullen for an assault & battery.
