

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to Clement Wilson, on account of harbouring Negro Stacy the property of Ignatius Thompson, of which he was convicted in St. Marys County Court, at March Term last, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

Wednesday March 21 1838.

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to Thomas W. Gorman, on account of permitting a Faro Table to be kept in his shop which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at February Term 1838, and for which he was sentenced to an imprisonment of thirty days, and to pay a fine of one thousand dollars, and His Excellency also remitted the said fine, to the extent of the interest of the State therein, with the exception of fifty dollars.

His Excellency also granted a Nolle Prosequi to Joseph Mayson on account of ~~per~~ charge of keeping a disorderly House, which was pending against him by two indictments in Anne Arundel County Court.

Upon the petition of William G. Penn, praying to be released from a forfeiture of fifty dollars which he had incurred by entering into a Recognizance in that sum for the appearance of Lewis Nyoff before Montgomery County Court, at November Term 1834, His Excellency the Governor remitted the said forfeiture.
