

Monday April 2nd 1835.

Upon the Petition of Richard KePyson, praying a remission of the penalty incurred by the Judgment of Charles Court for not keeping a Road of Purwich, he was overseer in repair, His Excellency the Governor, remitted the said penalty.

His Excellency granted a Pardon to Wm Hastings, alias John Hasty alias Gillis Kinnikin, on account of passing counterfeit notes, of which he was convicted in Dorchester County Court, at November Term 1833, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years. His Excellency also granted a commutation of the punishment of William Matthews on account of murder in the first degree, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at February Term last, and for which he was sentenced to be hung, and in lieu of the execution of said sentence ~~ordered~~ that the said William Matthews be confined in the Penitentiary for twelve years, one twentieth of which time to be kept in solitary confinement. Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Culbreth or order two hundred and fifty dollars for two months salary as Clerk of the Council, up to the last day of February last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John B Culbreth or order one hundred and sixty six dollars sixty six cents for one months services as Secretary to the Governor, of amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Kamey or order one hundred and thirty five dollars eighty seven cents for one quarters salary as Examiner General, due the first Instant, after deducting the amount of fees received, of amount proved.

Ordered that the Treasurer show pay Isaac Munsie or order eight dollars for one years subscription to the Baltimore Patriot, up to the 28th of January last, of amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard Crabbe or order thirty seven dollars ninety one cents for one months postage viz for the Executive \$27.13, for the Librarian \$3.92, for the Adjutant General 54 cents and for the Treasurer 38 cents, of amount allowed.
