Thursday May 3rd 1838.

His Excellency the Governor this day selected Mary B Wiley aged ten years, Rebecca Elizabeth Sableur aged seven years and John Shuler aged twelve years, all indigent blind children of the City of Baltimore to be educated at the expense of the State at the Pennsylvania Institution for the instruction of the blind.

Monday May 7th 1838.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a pardon to George Manspaw who had been convicted by Baltimore City Court at March Term eighteen hundred and thirty seven of manslaughter and sentenced to ten years confinement in the Penitentiary.

Thursday May 8th 1838.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a ~~pardon~~ Nolle Prosequi to Joseph Geary who had been presented by the grand Jury of Frederick County with the crime of Kidnapping.

His Excellency also remitted the fine which had been imposed by Saint Mary's County Court on William J Edelin, at March Term eighteen hundred and thirty eight, for an assault & battery on Chas Maxwell. The amount of fine was Fifty dollars.
