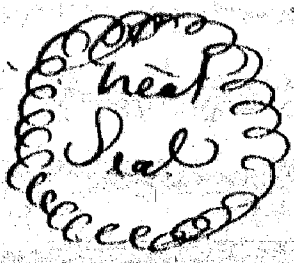

June 11<sup>th</sup> 1838.

His Excellency the Governor this day subscribed, on the part of the State, for one hundred and fifty copies of the volume of testamentary laws of this State proposed to be compiled and published by Judge Clement Dorsey.

June 12<sup>th</sup> 1838.

His Excellency the Governor, this day, released William Ashton from the payment of the recognizance of Fifty dollars entered into by him for the appearance at March Court 1838 of Jacob Mandell and which was afterwards forfeited.

June 14<sup>th</sup> 1838.

Treasurer of the Western Show pay to N. Wickman reader six dollars for the eighth number of the Indian Biography, furnished to the State Library, by authority of the Joint Committee, as per certificate of the Librarian.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon <sup>to John Price</sup> to John Price who was charged by Baltimore City Court with an assault and battery with intent to kill; (see pardon record)

also to Jacob Green who was charged by Baltimore City Court by three several presentments with Felony. (see pardon record)

also granted a pardon to Patience Morris, free negro, who was convicted at the May Term of Somerset County Court one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight of Larceny and sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary. (see pardon records)

also a pardon to Nehemiah Morris, free negro, who was convicted at May Term of Somerset County Court one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight of Felony and sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary.

June 15<sup>th</sup> 1838.

Treasurer of the Western pay Dobbin, Murphy & Doe on their order twenty five dollars and twenty five cents for publishing certain proclamations by order of the Governor and Council, as per account submitted.
