

His Excellency the Governor having received the evidence prescribed by the act of Congress, charging John W. Williams with the commission of crime in this State, and having fled from Justice to the District of Columbia, Commanded of the Chief Justice of the said District, that he surrender of the said John W. Williams as a fugitive from Justice as provided for by the Laws of the United States.

The Senate not being in Session, His Excellency the Governor appointed George W. Waller a Justice of the Sixth Election District Court in Allegany County, Vice John Wright resigned.

Friday August 31<sup>st</sup> 1838.
