each for the appearance of the said Charles Graham before Calvert
County Court at October Term 1835 to answer for an assault & battery

Ordered that the adjutant General furnish upon the
requisition of General Otto H Williams dated September 13th 1838,
25 Tent, 20 Camp Kettles, 40 Maps Pans, 200 Wrapsacks, 200 Coats,
200 musket Shirts and 200 Wipers.

or order seventy five dollars for one quarter Salary as a member
at Eaton, due the 1st instant. By Order of the Governor.
