Annapolis, October 8th. 1838.

John H Culbuth Esquire having resigned, His Excellency the Governor this day appoints Jos: H Chehobson Secretary of State.

He qualified by taking the several oaths required by the Constitution and the Laws.

By order of His Excellency the following drafts were drawn upon the Treasury for the Western Shore, and signed by the Secretary of State:
To wit:

In favor of His Excellency Gov. bearing for the quarters salary due him as the Governor of the State, on the first of October Inst. \$977. 68

In favor of Thomas Wadden for making tents as per account filed and allowed. \$406. 10

In favor of John Bacon for the tuition of deaf and dumb Pupils of this State at the Pennsylvania Institution from the 1st. of April to the 1st. of October 1838 as per account allowed and sent to the Treasury \$1200.

In favor of Washington G Pack for packing boxes, Remo. ving Muskets &c. as per account, filed and allowed. \$31. 75

In favor of William Durbin for the quarters salary due him, as Adjutant at Frederick, on the First day of October Inst. \$75. 00

In favor of John H Culbuth for the amount of salary due him, as Secretary of State, from the 1st. of October Inst. to the 8th. of October Inst. the day on which he resigned \$33. 33

His Excellency the Governor appointed Richard Wells Esquire Master of Line Stock for the City of Baltimore.
