

Tuesday October 16th. 1838.

By direction of His Excellency the Governor, a Wells Pass was issued and delivered to Henry A. Pason, Cashier of the Chesapeake Bank of Cecil County, who had been presented by the grand jury of Cecil County for paying out notes of a ten denomination and five dollars.

Thursday. November 1st. 1838

By direction of His Excellency the Governor, the following Drafts were drawn upon the Treasurer for the Western Shore, and signed by the Secretary of State. To wit:

In favor of Richard S. Cubb for postage for the month of October last past as per account allowed and filed \$39.05

In favor of Elizabeth Simmons for six months salary for cleaning the public temple \$13.50

In favor of Col. J. J. Abert on account of certain maps for the purpose of ascertaining the practicability of constructing a Canal from the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Baltimore City and Thruway by Resolutions No. 26 of December Session 1837 \$5000

John Matthews to be Justice of the Orphans Court of Charles County via George Brent deceased.

John D. Freeman to be associate Justice of the District Court for the First District of Charles County via Henry C. Bruce deceased.

Thursday November 3rd. 1838.

By direction of His Excellency the Governor, the following Drafts were drawn upon the Treasurer, and signed by the Secretary of State.

In favor of John K. Longwell, publisher of the Metropolitan Couriers for publishing the amended constitution and the rules of Carroll County Court and per account allowed and filed \$73.00

In favor of David Ridgeley for arranging and reading documents Dec. under Resolution No. 66 December Session 1837, per account allowed and filed \$32.00

In favor of William Kirby for candles furnished the State Department per account allowed and filed \$5.00

In favor of William R. Glasgow for balance due for the purchase of lots and the erection of Hay racks Dec. in the City of Baltimore, in virtue of the act of Assembly of December Session 1837 ch. 319 \$100.00
