

By direction of His Excellency the Governor the following proceedings were had:

A Writ Prosequi granted to Joseph L. Bland for a Felony, and recommended to the clemency of the Governor by the Judge of Baltimore City Court.

A Commission issued to Tilghman Johnson as Sheriff of Calverton County since Joseph P. W. Richardson deceased.

Monday, November 8th. 1838.

By direction of the Governor, the following proceedings were had.

A draft was made upon the Treasury, signed by the Secretary of State in favor of Thomas Culbert, late Clerk of the Council, for recording Civil Commissions under the act of 1835 chap. 55, Sect. 30. from the 9th. of February 1836 to the 9th. of February 1838 inclusive, as per account allowed and filed, for \$3092.25

Ordered, that the Adjutant General, upon the requisition of Genl. Sewall, dated Oct. 20th. 1838 furnish him for the arms of Capt. G. B. Howard's Company in Elkton with fifty stands of muskets with the necessary accoutrements and two thousand ball cartridges upon filing bond, as required by the act of 1834 chapter 251.

A Commission issued to Hugh Dowling, as Auctioneer within the limits of the City of Baltimore - former Commission having expired.

A draft was made on the Treasury in favor of David Ridgeley for amount due for certain periodicals furnished the State Library, as per account allowed and filed \$27.00

Pardons were granted and issued to William Field, Sick Gould and James Taylor, convicts in the Penitentiary.

Tuesday, November 10th. 1838

By direction of the Governor the following proceedings were had.

A draft was drawn on the Treasury in favor of Richard Kelly Howard to the Governor for the amount of salary due him to the 23rd. day of October ult. upon which day he qualified as Sheriff of Linn County. \$15.98
