Wednesday, December 5th. 1838

By order of the Governor the following proceedings were had.
Mary Turner of Baltimore City was selected to be sent to the
Pennsylvania Institution for the instruction of the Blind.
A pardon was granted to George McCreedy found guilty in
Baltimore City Court at October Term 1838 of an assault and bat-
tery under the 17th. Section of the Act of 1837 Chap. 833 upon con-
dition that he pay the fine imposed by the Court.
A pardon was granted to Ignatius Bayley who was fined at
August Term 1838 of Charles County Court for failure to perform
his duty as Overseer of the Roads.

John S. Ward was appointed a District Justice in the 5th. Elec-
tion District of Charles County vice Raphael C. Edelin resigned.

Saturday, December 8th. 1838.

A pardon was granted to John Fuchs, found guilty in Wash-
ington County Court of taking two bushels of chopped Rye,
and sentenced to the Penitentiary for one year and nine months.

A draft was drawn on the Treasury in favor of Washington
Fuchs for commission on the amount of purchase of tobacco
and cash advanced as per account and vouchers allowed and
filed. \$104.97

A draft was drawn on the Treasury in favor of Henry
Thompson for the purchase of Fine wool for the State House, to
be accounted for \$1.85
