Registers made out and preserved by them in virtue of the Act aforesaid
said of December Session 1837 Chapter 338.

And Whereas on the 2nd day of January Instant I have
with the said certificate to the General Assembly, as required of
me by the said recited section of the Act aforesaid.

And Whereas I have this day been informed by a direct com-
munication from the Honorable Richard Thomas, President of the Senate
and the Honorable Augustus R. Tolson, Speaker pro tem of the House of
Delegates of Maryland that it appears from the said certificate of the
Registers of Voters for the City of Baltimore, transmitted aforesaid, that a
majority of the legal voters of the City of Baltimore did not decide against the
Law passed at December Session 1837 Chapter 339 as aforesaid.

Now, Therefore, I Thomas W. Blaney Governor
of the State of Maryland, in pursuance of the authority vested in
me as aforesaid, do here by Proclaim that the Act passed at De-
cember Session 1837 Chapter 339 entitled "An Act to guard against
fraud in the exercise of the elective franchise in the City of Baltimore,
and to secure the rights of voters and to establish with greater certainty
the rules of evidence to be observed at all elections in said City" is and
continues to be, in full force and effect.
