Sir,

Yours of the 19th Instant to His Excellency the Governor
was duly received and submitted to the Council. Upon examination
of our Military Record it appears that Captain Myers, whom you
recommended for Lieutenant Colonel of the 5th Cavalry Regiment, some
years since, resigned the Commission which he held as Captain,
and that Captain Boulton, whom you recommended for Major,
was appointed his Successor, and still holds his Commission as such,
which Captain Myers is out of the Corps. Under these circumstances,
the Executive declined making the appointments, you named, without
some information or explanation of the reasons for promoting Myers
over Boulton.

By direction of the Governor & Council, I send you
