Sir,

Mr McGraw, the agent appointed to receive John Eagan
as a fugitive from Pennsylvania, upon a second demand of His
Excellency Governor Wolf, has left the papers with me to be sent
to Governor Thomas, who is absent from the Seat of Government.
Since the first demand, Eagan has sent to His Excellency Governor
Thomas depositions intended to prove, that he was not a fugitive
from Pennsylvania, and that the offence alleged against him, if
committed at all, could not have been committed in Pennsylvania.
On examination of the deposition accompanying the Demand, I
find that it does not state where the offence was committed, and
my present impression is that it is not sufficient evidence to support
the demand. I shall, however, immediately transmit the papers to
Governor Thomas for his decision upon them, and in the meantime
should be glad to have your views upon the case, should they upon
mature consideration differ from mine.

As soon as I receive Governor Thomas' decision, and
directions, should he comply with the demand, the proper authority
for the arrest and surrender of Eagan will be sent to Mr McGraw
the agent, but if he should decline a compliance, Governor Wolf
and yourself shall both be informed of the reasons on which his
decision will be made.
