The following message was this day received from the Senate in Executive Session.

By the Senate in Executive Session February 28th 1839

To the Governor of Maryland

The Senate inform the Governor of their willingness to receive again the nomination of Francis Gallagher as Inspector of Leather &c

In their previous decision upon that nomination, the Senate were governed exclusively by the opinions of persons most deeply interested in maintaining the high character of the Baltimore Inspection; by whom it was alleged, that the public interest would be promoted by confining the selection of Inspector to a class of mechanics whose previous pursuits would insure their qualification for the office.

To this class Mr Gallagher does not belong. As these opinions were most strongly urged by Mr Gallagher's political friends, the Senate in yielding to their force hoped to have found in the future nominations of your Excellency, your sanction of these views taken by the chief representatives of the important interests affected by this appointment. Your Excellency, however has nominated Mr Layhuff, a gentleman of the same profession as Mr Gallagher and on that account
