William A. Lupton who had been convicted in Baltimore City Court of stealing a coat for - Pardon
turned for a pardon. He was recommended by the Court and it appearing from the statement of
the prosecutor doubtful whether in committing the act complained of there was any criminal intent
and his previous character being represented as good he was pardoned.

Administrators of Henry B. Anthony deceased petitioned for the remission of a recognizance and which of a property
the said Anthony had entered in his lifetime for the appearance of Maria Mafey before Queen Anne's County
Court to answer the charge of stealing one boat of meat.

The petition was accom-
panied by a transcript of the record and the recommendation of one of the Judges of the said Court,
and stated that the administrator was not aware of the existence of the said recognizance un-
til summoned as administrator to answer the same, and that the said Anthony was induced to enter into the
same by the strong protestations of the said Maria of her innocence of the charge and of her willing-
ness to stand a trial therefor. The said recognizance was accordingly remitted upon the condition
of the payment of costs.

and. He was recommended to mercy by the Court on account of great age and infirmities. He
was pardoned on condition of leaving the State.
