Bond Philip Boney's Bond as Amosure at Eastern was this day received and approved

Demand of a fugitive The Governor of Georgia demanded as a fugitive from Justice Thomas N. Hatch charged with having stolen negroes in that State. He was given up to A. G. Ridgely the agent appointed by the Governor of Georgia to receive him

March 23<sup>rd</sup>

Demand of a fugitive The Governor of South Carolina demanded William Edmunds alias William Allen alias Night Allen as a fugitive from Justice charged with negro stealing in that State. He was given up to Alexander Brown the Agent appointed by the Governor of South Carolina to receive him.

Edmunds alias Allen was in the custody of the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore City and County at the time of the demand charged with obtaining money by false pretences in this State and the Governor exercised his discretion in ordering him to be delivered over to the authorities of South Carolina.
