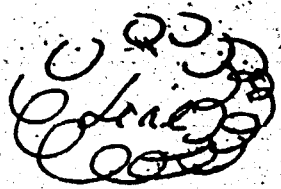

Also from the Chief Justice of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia Loyall Burrell was fugitive from justice in the following words: To William Cramish Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia

Demanded  
as fugitive

Whereas Loyall Burrell stands charged by Indictment in Baltimore City Court with procuring goods by false pretences. And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State that the said Loyall Burrell hath fled from Justice and taken refuge within the District of Columbia. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of society, that the perpetrators of such offence should be brought to justice. Now therefore I William Sprason Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby request your Honor because the said Loyall Burrell is apprehended as a fugitive from the justice of this State and make known that I have appointed Ezekiel Burke my agent to receive the said fugitive and bring him on to this State having jurisdiction of the offence charged against him as aforesaid, that he may be brought to trial therefor. In compliance with the requisitions of the Law. I herewith annex and produce a copy of the Indictment upon which this demand is founded which I certify is authentic.

The Governor of New Jersey demanded as a fugitive from justice Norman Hoyt Sumner Michael charged with having stolen a horse in that State. He was delivered up to A. G. Kitzelby and Nicholas Jenkins agents appointed by the Governor of New Jersey to receive him.

July 26<sup>th</sup>

The Governor of New York demanded Henry Bright charged with having stolen a box of sundries from the ship Dutchess at Orleans while acting as the mate thereof. He was delivered up to Jesse P. Albright the agent appointed by the Governor of New York to receive him.

Complaint was made by John Neen the agent appointed to receive from the Governor of Pennsylvania, negro Isaac Cummings, of having been arrested on a charge of kidnaping in York Penn<sup>a</sup> while acting under the authority of the Governor of that State. A copy thereof was sent to Penn<sup>a</sup> to the Governor with a letter from Governor Sprason.
