The Governor of Pennsylvania demanded the surrender of John W. Bideman charged with fornication and bastardy in that State. He was accordingly ordered to be apprehended and delivered to Michael H. Myers the agent appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania to receive him.

October 29th

October 30th

The petition was accompanied by a transcript from the record and it appearing that he had made his appearance at the last Term of the Court and had attended before the forfeiture the same was remitted.

On the same day Robert Melch of Ber. who was bound for the said Stewart same also filed his petition and the same recognizance was also remitted as to him.
